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Non Uniqueness of p -adic Gibbs Distribution for the Ising Model on the Lattice \mathbf{Z}^d

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In this paper, we show non uniqueness of p -adic Gibbs distribution for the Ising model on the \mathbf{Z}^d . Moreover, we prove that a p -adic Gibbs distribution is bounded if and only if $p \neq 2$.

Keywords: Gibbs distribution, Ising model, lattice.

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Introduction

Real Gibbs measures arise in many problems of probability theory and statistical mechanics. This measure, related to the Boltzmann distribution, generalizes the notion of canonical ensemble. In addition, Gibbs measure is unique measure that maximizes the entropy of the expected energy. But non-archimedean (p -adic) analogue of Gibbs measures have been little studied. It is known that in the case of real numbers concepts of Gibbs measure and Markov random field are identical. But in the p -adic case, the class of p -adic Markov random fields is wider than the class of p -adic Gibbs measures [1]. One of the main problems of physics is to study the set of all p -adic Gibbs measures (see e.g. [1, 2]).

Let us present some main definitions from the theory of p -adic numbers (see [3–5]). Let p be a prime number. Every rational number $x \neq 0$ can be represented in the form $x = p^r \frac{n}{m}$, where $r, n \in \mathbb{Z}$, m is a positive number, $(n, m) = 1$, where m and n are not divisible by p . A p -adic norm of rational number $x = p^r \frac{n}{m}$ is defined as follows

$$|x|_p = \begin{cases} p^{-r}, & \text{if } x \neq 0, \\ 0, & \text{if } x = 0. \end{cases}$$

The completion of the set of rational numbers \mathbb{Q} under p -adic norm leads to the field of p -adic numbers \mathbb{Q}_p for every prime p . This p -adic norm satisfies the strong triangle inequality:

$$|x + y|_p \leq \max\{|x|_p, |y|_p\}. \quad (1)$$

This property shows that p -adic norm is a non-Archimedean norm.

It immediately follows from the strong triangle inequality that

- 1) if $|x|_p \neq |y|_p$, then $|x + y|_p = \max\{|x|_p, |y|_p\}$;
- 2) if $|x|_p = |y|_p$, then $|x + y|_p \leq |x|_p$; For $a \in \mathbb{Q}_p$ and $r > 0$ we introduce

$$B(a, r) = \{x \in \mathbb{Q}_p : |x - a|_p < r\}.$$

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The p -adic logarithm is defined as

$$\log_p(x) = \log_p(1 + (x - 1)) = \sum_{n=1}^{\infty} (-1)^{n+1} \frac{(x - 1)^n}{n}.$$

The power series converges for $x \in B(1, 1)$. The p -adic exponent is defined as

$$\exp_p(x) = \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} \frac{x^n}{n!}$$

and the power series converges for $x \in B(0, p^{-1/(p-1)})$.

Let $x \in B(0, p^{-1/(p-1)})$. Then

$$\begin{aligned} |\exp_p(x)|_p &= 1, \quad |\exp_p(x) - 1|_p = |x|_p, \quad |\log_p(1 + x)|_p = |x|_p, \\ \log_p(\exp_p(x)) &= x, \quad \exp_p(\log_p(1 + x)) = 1 + x. \end{aligned}$$

Let (X, \mathcal{B}) be a measurable space, where \mathcal{B} is an algebra of subsets of X . The function $\mu : \mathcal{B} \rightarrow \mathbb{Q}_p$ is a p -adic distribution if for any $A_1, \dots, A_n \in \mathcal{B}$ such that $A_i \cap A_j = \emptyset$ ($i \neq j$) we have the equality

$$\mu \left(\bigcup_{j=1}^n A_j \right) = \sum_{j=1}^n \mu(A_j).$$

A p -adic distribution is a measure if

$$\sup\{|\mu(A)|_p : A \in \mathcal{B}\} < \infty.$$

A p -adic measure is a probability measure if $\mu(X) = 1$.

Let us consider the set of points $x = (x_1, \dots, x_d)$, $x_i \in Z$, $i = 1, \dots, d$, i.e., the d is dimensional integer lattice Z^d with metric $\rho(x'; x'') = \sum_{i=1}^d |x'_i - x''_i|$. Two points x and y of the lattice Z^d are called *nearest-neighbors* if $\rho(x; y) = 1$. It is symbolized by $\langle x, y \rangle$.

Let \mathbb{Q}_p be the set of p -adic numbers and $\Phi = \{-1, +1\}$ is the set of spin values. By standard way we can define the real (see [6]) or p -adic (see [1]) Gibbs distribution for the Ising model.

For some natural number n the set

$$M_n = \left\{ x = (x_1, \dots, x_d), x_i \geq 0, i = 1, \dots, d : \rho_1(x, x_0) \leq n \right\}$$

is called the fundamental quadrate. A point $x \in Z^d \setminus M_n$ is called nearest-neighbor of the set M_n if there exists $y \in M_n$ such that $\langle x, y \rangle$, i.e., $\rho(x; y) = 1$. The set of all nearest-neighbors of M_n is called the quadrate contour of M_n and it is designated as ∂M_n . Configuration σ defined on the set Z^d is a function $x \in Z^d \rightarrow \sigma(x) \in \Phi$. Restriction of σ on any subset $V \subset Z^d$ is designated as $\sigma(V)$, i.e., $\sigma(V) = \{\sigma(x), x \in V\}$. The set of all configurations on M_n is denoted by Ω_n and the set of all configurations on Z^d is denoted by Ω . Hamiltonian of the p -adic Ising model is defined as follows:

$$H(\sigma) = -J \sum_{\langle x, y \rangle} \sigma(x)\sigma(y), \text{ where } |J|_p \leq \frac{1}{p}. \quad (2)$$

Conditional Hamiltonian $H_n(\sigma | \sigma')$, $\sigma, \sigma' \in \Omega$ of the p -adic Ising model on M_n has the form

$$H_n(\sigma | \sigma') = -J \sum_{\substack{\langle x, y \rangle \\ x, y \in M_n}} \sigma(x)\sigma(y) - J \sum_{\substack{\langle x, y \rangle \\ x \in M_n, y \in \partial M_n}} \sigma(x)\sigma'(y).$$

In this paper, p -adic Gibbs distributions for the p -adic Ising model on Z^d are studied.

1. The p -adic Gibbs distributions

The p -adic conditional Gibbs distribution for configurations σ on the quadrate M_n and σ' on $Z^d \setminus M_n$ with the Hamiltonian $H_n(\sigma | \sigma')$ is the following p -adic number

$$\mu_n(\sigma | \sigma') = \frac{\exp_p(-H_n(\sigma | \sigma'))}{\sum_{\sigma \in \Omega_n} \exp_p(-H_n(\sigma | \sigma'))}. \quad (3)$$

Let us consider the following configurations:

$$\sigma^+ = \{\sigma(x) \equiv 1\}, \quad \sigma^- = \{\sigma(x) \equiv -1\}.$$

For configurations σ^+ and σ^- we define two p -adic Gibbs conditional distributions on the quadrate M_n :

$$\mu_n^\varepsilon(\sigma) = \mu(\sigma(M_n) | \sigma^\varepsilon(Z^d \setminus M_n)) = \frac{\exp_p(-H_n^\varepsilon(\sigma))}{z_n^\varepsilon}, \quad \varepsilon = -, +,$$

where

$$\begin{aligned} H_n^\varepsilon(\sigma) &= -J \sum_{\substack{\langle x, y \rangle \\ x, y \in M_n}} \sigma(x)\sigma(y) - \varepsilon J \sum_{\substack{\langle x, y \rangle \\ x \in M_n, y \in \partial M_n}} \sigma(x), \\ z_n^\varepsilon &= \sum_{\sigma \in \Omega_n} \exp_p(-H_n^\varepsilon(\sigma)). \end{aligned} \quad (4)$$

Lemma 1. *If $p \neq 2$, $|J|_p \leq \frac{1}{p}$ then $|H(\sigma)|_p \leq \frac{1}{p}$.*

Proof. Taking into account the strong triangle inequality and using $|\sigma(x)|_p \equiv 1$, we obtain

$$|H(\sigma)|_p = \left| J \sum_{\langle x, y \rangle} \sigma(x)\sigma(y) \right|_p \leq |J|_p \leq \frac{1}{p}.$$

□

Lemma 2. *If $p \neq 2$ then $z_n^+ = z_n^-$ and $|z_n^+|_p = |z_n^-|_p = 1$.*

Proof. Let $p \neq 2$. From $H_n^+(\sigma) = H_n^-(\sigma)$ we obtain $z_n^+ = z_n^-$. Let us consider the following chain of equalities:

$$\begin{aligned} |z_n^+|_p &= \left| \sum_{\sigma \in \Omega_n} \exp_p(-H_n^+(\sigma)) \right|_p = \left| \sum_{\sigma \in \Omega_n} (\exp_p(-H_n^+(\sigma)) - 1) + |\Omega_n| \right|_p = \\ &= \max \left\{ \left| \sum_{\sigma \in \Omega_n} (\exp_p(-H_n^+(\sigma)) - 1) \right|_p ; \left| |\Omega_n| \right|_p \right\} = \left| |\Omega_n| \right|_p = \left| 2^{n^d} \right|_p = 1. \end{aligned}$$

□

Let us introduce the following notation

$$H_n(\sigma) = -J \sum_{x, y \in M_n} \langle x, y \rangle \sigma(x)\sigma(y).$$

Theorem 1. *Let $p \neq 2$. Suppose that there exist limits*

$$\lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} \mu_n^\pm(\sigma) = \mu^\pm.$$

Then p -adic measures μ^+ and μ^- are different. In addition, for any $r \in N$ a configuration σ can be found such that $|\mu^+(\sigma) - \mu^-(\sigma)|_p = |J|_p \cdot p^{-r}$.

Proof. Let $a_n(\sigma) = |\mu_n^+(\sigma) - \mu_n^-(\sigma)|_p$.
Using Lemmas 1 and 2, we have

$$\begin{aligned} a_n(\sigma) &= \left| \frac{\exp_p(-H_n^+(\sigma))}{z_n^+} - \frac{\exp_p(-H_n^-(\sigma))}{z_n^+} \right|_p = \\ &= \frac{1}{|z_n^+|_p} \left| \exp_p(H_n(\sigma)) \left(\exp_p \left(J \sum_{\substack{\langle x,y \rangle \\ x \in M_n, y \in \partial M_n}} \sigma(x) \right) - \exp_p \left(-J \sum_{\substack{\langle x,y \rangle \\ x \in M_n, y \in \partial M_n}} \sigma(x) \right) \right) \right|_p = \\ &= \left| \exp_p \left(2J \sum_{\substack{\langle x,y \rangle \\ x \in M_n, y \in \partial M_n}} \sigma(x) \right) - 1 \right|_p = \left| 2J \sum_{\substack{\langle x,y \rangle \\ x \in M_n, y \in \partial M_n}} \sigma(x) \right|_p = \left| 2J \left(2dn^{d-1} - 2s^-(\sigma^{(n)}) \right) \right|_p, \end{aligned}$$

where $\sigma^{(n)} = \{\sigma(x), x \in \partial M_n\}$ and $s^-(\sigma^{(n)})$ is the number of elements of the set

$$\{x \in \partial M_n : \sigma(x) = -1\}.$$

Let $n_0 = \left\lceil \left(\frac{p^r}{2d} \right)^{\frac{1}{d-1}} \right\rceil$. Note that for all $n > n_0$ the difference $2dn^{d-1} - p^r$ is a natural number.

Then there exists a configuration σ such that $\sigma|_{\partial M_n} = \sigma^{(n)}$ and $s^-(\sigma^{(n)}) = 2n - p^r$. For such n the equality $a_n(\sigma^{(n)}) = |4J|_p \cdot p^{-r} = |J|_p \cdot p^{-r}$ holds. Therefore we have $\lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} a_n(\sigma) = |J|_p \cdot p^{-r}$. \square

Proposition 1. A cardinality of the set $\{\sigma : |\mu_n^+(\sigma) - \mu_n^-(\sigma)|_p = |J|_p \cdot p^{-r}\}$ is continuum.

2. Boundedness of p -adic Gibbs measures.

In this section we obtain the condition for p -adic Gibbs distribution to be a measure (bounded) for the Ising model.

Theorem 2. A p -adic Gibbs distribution for the Ising model is bounded if and only if $p \neq 2$.

Proof. Consider the following expression for $|\mu(\sigma_n)|_p$:

$$\begin{aligned} |\mu(\sigma_n)|_p &= \left| \frac{\exp_p(H(\sigma_n))}{\sum_{\varphi_n \in \Omega_n} \exp_p(H(\varphi_n))} \right|_p = \\ &= \frac{1}{\left| \sum_{\sigma \in \Omega_n} (\exp_p(-H(\sigma)) - 1) + |\Omega_n| \right|_p} = \frac{1}{\left| \sum_{\sigma \in \Omega_n} (\exp_p(-H(\sigma)) - 1) + 2n^d \right|_p} = 1 \end{aligned}$$

if $p \neq 2$.

To prove unboundedness of μ for $p = 2$ one needs only to show that μ is not bounded on some path in Z^d . Let $\pi = \{\dots, x_{-1}, x_0, x_1, \dots\}$ be a path in Z^d . Marginal distributions on π is of the form

$$\mu_\pi(w_n) = P_{w(x_{-n})} \prod_{m=-n}^{n-1} P_{w(x_m)w(x_{m+1})}, \quad (5)$$

where w_n is a configuration on $\{x_{-n}, \dots, x_0, \dots, x_n\}$ and P_i are coordinates of invariant vector of the matrix

$$\mathbf{P} = (P_{ij}) = \frac{1}{\exp_p(J) + \exp_p(-J)} \begin{pmatrix} \exp_p(J) & \exp_p(-J) \\ \exp_p(-J) & \exp_p(J) \end{pmatrix}.$$

We have

$$|P_{ij}|_2 = \frac{1}{|\exp_p(J) + \exp_p(-J)|_2} = \frac{1}{|(\exp_p(J) - 1) + (\exp_p(-J) - 1) + 2|_2} \geq 2. \quad (6)$$

It follows from (5) and (6) that μ is unbounded for $p = 2$. □

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Неединственность p -адического распределения Гиббса для модели Изинга на решетке Z^d

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В данной работе для модели Изинга на Z^d мы покажем неединственность p -адического распределения Гиббса. Кроме того, докажем, что p -адические гиббсовские распределение являются ограниченными тогда и только тогда, когда $p \neq 2$.
